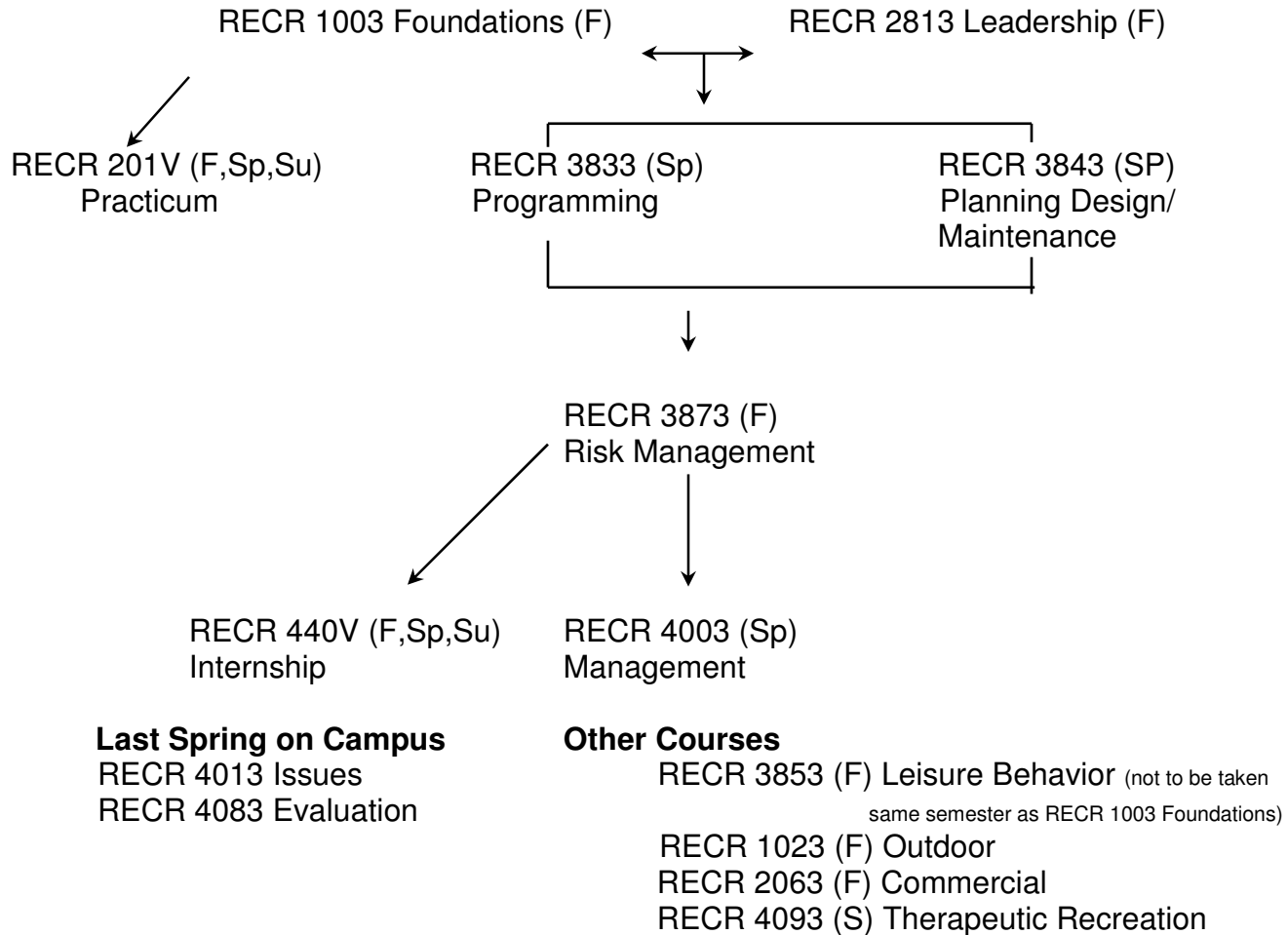


Recreation Curriculum Requirements
